## ETYMOLOGY

## SHAKESPEAREAN THEATER

- Know Shakespeare's biography
- Know important literary terms from this section (definition and common examples from the play): dramatic irony, foil, comic relief, prologue, internal conflict, external conflict, tragic flaw, dialogue, soliloquy, tragedy, blank verse, aside, tragic hero, monologue, foreshadow,
- *Romeo and Juliet* – characters, plot, setting, examples of lit terms found in the play, themes
- Know the Shakespearean Theater: similarities and differences to today's theater, the Globe Theater

## WEST SIDE STORY

- Know characters, plot, setting, conflicts, themes
- Be able to identify similarities and differences between *Romeo and Juliet* and *WSS*

## POETRY

- Terms: meter, rhythm, rhyme scheme, catalectic, iambic, syllable, foot, stanza
- Apply them in the context of a real poem

## DIAGRAMS

- Know how to diagram: verbals, verbal phrases, independent clauses, noun clauses, adverb clauses, adjective clauses, sentence structures
  - You will NOT be writing your own
  - You WILL be identifying aspects of the diagram in a multiple choice, true/false or matching format
